The Allergy and Immunology Foundation of Australasia (AIFA) is a charity dedicated to improving the health of people living with allergic diseases, immunodeficiencies and other immune diseases (such as Lupus and Wegener's Granulomatosis).

AIFA helps to fund medical research projects that will lead to the better detection of disease, strategies for prevention, improved treatments and potential cures. We also aim to raise awareness of allergy and immune disease.
